Maths

10

This half term we will be learning to:

- Have a deep understanding of number to 10, including the composition of each number.
- Automatically recall number bonds up to
 5 (including subtraction facts) and some number bonds to
 10, including doubles facts.
- Compare quantities up to 10, explore and represent patterns and verbally count beyond 20.

We will also solve problems including doubling, halving and sharing.

Everyday maths:

The children access our maths areas as part of their own independent learning, giving them a range of exciting open-ended opportunities to extend their thinking and explore their mathematical fascinations through open-ended play.

Physical Education

The children will have one PE session each week.

This will be outdoors, weather permitting. This term we will develop skills of balancing and coordination. We will use ball skills with developing competence and accuracy. We will play cooperatively, take turns and follow instructions to play games fairly.

Class 1 and 2 PE: Thursday

Please ensure that your child wears their PE kit to school on their PE days. This includes trainers, joggers or shorts and a t-shirt and a sweatshirt or hoodie if it is a cooler day. Please be reminded that earrings cannot be worn in PE and long hair must be tied back. Unfortunately, we cannot remove earrings from your child, so please remember to do so on the required days.

Forest School

This half term we will be creating art using natural materials. We will hunt for plants, minibeasts and animals looking after them carefully. We will model and encourage the children to use accurate scientific vocabulary for living things. Forest School sessions may include active games, creative activities and teach the children about managing risks, outdoor safety and how to care for the natural world. All children will need to come to school in their usual school uniform on Forest School days, ensuring that their arms and legs are covered. School trousers and a top with a cardigan/sweatshirt is ideal, If the weather is wet, we will provide your child with an all-inone suit to wear. If you have your own suit, please feel free to send it in with your child in a named bag.
