Maths

This half term we will be learning to:

- interpret charts and diagrams;
- accurately measure mass, volume, capacity and temperature;
- use standard units for these measures;
- use different scales (such as scales that increase in 2s, 5s and 10s)
 and how to work out the value of each increment on the scale
- use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement, including movement in a straight line and distinguishing between rotation as a turn and in terms of right angles for quarter, half and three-quarter turns (clockwise and anticlockwise)

Maths gym

This half term we will be learning to:

- consolidate number problem solving using efficient methods
- reason and generalise about patterns, such as odd and even
- use commutative and inverse strategies when adding, subtracting, dividing and multiplying

PSHE

Our Managing Change unit in PSHE will give the children the opportunity to recognise that they are growing and that their achievements, skills and responsibilities are changing.
