Maths

This half term we will be learning to:

- Understand doubles and halves
- Count in multiples of 10
- Add and subtract 10 to a multiple of 10
- Use known facts within ten to add multiples of 10.
- Count to 100 and beyond.
- Count tens and ones.
- Compare numbers to 100.
- Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.
- Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

Maths gym

This half term in maths gym sessions we will be:

- Continuing partitioning odd and even numbers and using this to subtract
- Composing teen numbers into ten and a bit
- Comparing and ordering teen numbers
- Writing equations using correct symbols

Physical Education

In Year 1 the children will have one PE session each week. This will include both indoor and outdoor PE.

Children will be provided with an all-in-one waterproof suit to wear **over their usual school uniform.** We suggest that all children wear trousers on Forest School days so they are comfortable in the suits. 

Homework:

Phonics

Through our daily phonics lessons we will learn to:

- read and spell words with split vowel digraphs: a-e, e-e, i-e, o-e and u-e;
- recognise the k sound in skin and sketch;
- add the prefix un- to words e.g. unhappy;
- understand that c can make /s/ in words like cell;
- understand that ea can make /e/ in words like bread and head; understand that ie can make /ee/ in words like chief:
- recap that y makes /ee/ at the end of words like very.

Homework

Homework will be sent home each week via a **nornework book** and consist of phonics, spelling and/or maths challenges.
