- Write simple fractions, for example, 1/2 of 6 = 3, and recognise the equivalence of 2/4 and 1/2.



They will explore texts about worries that are safe and unsafe. They will discuss secrets that are safe, such as a birthday surprise, and secrets that make them feel unsafe. They will understand the key principles that we all have the right to feel safe and if we don't, we can talk to someone in our network of support. The children will listen to scenarios, including the internet and make decisions if the secret is safe or unsafe. We are also participating in the NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme this term. This aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline. This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed carefully.
