This half term we will be learning to:

Number - Place Value:

- count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
- count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals
- count in multiples of twos, fives and tens
- read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words.
- represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20.

Number – addition and subtraction:

- represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20
- read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (–) and equals (=) signs.

This term in maths fluency sessions we will be reading and writing numbers 0-10 in numerals and words and exploring all the ways to make 1,2,3,4 and 5 using a systematic approach.

This half term we will be learning to:

Reading

- apply phase 3 phonics knowledge and skills to decode words
- read common exception words, noting unusual correspondences between spelling and sound
- discussing word meanings, linking new meanings to those already known
- participate in discussion about what is read to them, taking turns and listening to what others say

Writing

- spell words using phase 3 phonics already taught
- spell common exception words
- name the letters of the alphabet in order
- use letter names
- begin to form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place

PSHE

This half term our main focus will be on beginnings and belonging, where we:

- participate in discussions about how to make the classroom a place they can learn safely and happily.
- participate in activities that enable them to develop collaborative relationships within the class.
- recognise what it feels like to be new in school.
- give ideas about how to make new people feel welcome in the class.
- learn to know who and what might help them if they are in a new situation.
- identify adults who can help them if they need support.
- learn to know how to ask for help and to have some ideas about they can help each other.

Forest School



During the autumn term, we will be observing seasonal change, comparing autumn and winter, and exploring what we can do on our forest school site. We will hunt for plants and minibeasts, using collection pots, observational drawing, labels and pictograms to present what we find, and always encourage the children to use accurate scientific vocabulary for these living things. During forest school sessions we will include active games and teach the children about managing risks, outdoor safety and how to care for the natural world. Children will be provided with an all-in-one waterproof suit to wear over their usual school uniform. We suggest that all children wear trousers on Forest School days so they are comfortable in the suits. We ask that all children bring in a pair of welly boots to wear. Please use our class welly racks to store boots

Phonics

Through our daily phonics lessons we will learn to:

- name the letters of the alphabet
- read and write Year 1 Common Exception Words (CEWs) e.g. the, today, were, said, he, she, they
- read and write the numbers one - ten in words
- recap phase 3 digraphs; ch, th, sh, ng, ai, igh, oa, ee, oo, (short) or, ar, oo (long), ur, oi, ow, er, ear, air and ure
- blend and read these phase 4 consonant clusters: sk, lt, lp, if, pt, scr, shr, thr, nch, str, fr, nl, fl, gl, pl, cl, sl, sp, st, tw, sm, pr, sc, sk and sn
- apply phonics knowledge to every day reading and writing.



Homework



Homework will **begin on Friday 16th September** and then sent home each week via **Tapestry** and consist of challenges (linked to current learning) that your child can choose from and present in their own way. It will be posted as a joint Year 1 observation on Tapestry each **Friday** and needs to be completed and uploaded as an individual observation for your child by the following **Wednesday**. Please support and encourage your child when they are doing their homework, although it should primarily be their own work. All work will be viewed by the class teacher and "liked". Your child would also significantly benefit from daily reading with you using the book sent home in their bookbag and/or **Bug Club** to reinforce the phonics and reading skills they are learning in school. The children will also be given access to **Numbots**, look out for a letter in the next couple of weeks.
