

Maths



This half term we will be learning to:

- read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and words.
- recognise the place value of each digit in a two digit number [tens, ones].
- use knowledge of place value and number facts to investigate and solve problems.
- count in steps of 2, 3, 5 and 10 and tens from any number, forward and backward.
- recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts to 100.
- compare and order numbers from 0-100 and use greater and less than symbols.
- solve addition and subtraction calculations using concrete objects, pictorial representations and mentally.

Maths gym

This half term we will be learning our:

- number bonds to 20 e.g. $0 + 20 = 20$ and $1 + 19 = 20$
- addition and subtraction facts e.g. adding 0 to a given number to 10 ($0 + 2 = 2$)

English



This half term we will be learning to:

- write sentences using full stops, capital letters and commas.
- add suffixes: using -ing and -ed where no change is needed in the spelling of the root word.
- segment spoken words into phonemes and represent these by graphemes spelling many correctly.
- use the coordinating conjunction "and" to join clauses/words.
- use the subordination conjunction "because" to add detail.
- identify noun phrases and begin to expand these by using adjectives to create expanded noun phrases.
- identify the features of a narrative text such as story language, setting and characters.
- look at a wide range of stories and identify similarities and familiar patterns in the sequence of the stories.
- answer questions about stories to improve comprehension.
- write a story for the wordless picture book "Journey".

PSHE

In PSHE this half term we will be discussing our rights and responsibilities inside and outside school and consider how these change as we grow up. We will be developing and expressing opinions, listening to others, taking turns and showing respect for each other. Our lessons on democracy and decision making will teach us how democratic decisions affect us everyday in class and will prepare us for voting for and electing school councillors during Parliament Week in November.



Forest School

During the autumn term, we will be observing seasonal change, comparing autumn and winter, and exploring what we can do on our forest school site. We will hunt for plants and minibeasts, using collection pots, observational drawing, labels and pictograms to present what we find, and always encourage the children to use accurate scientific vocabulary for these living things. During forest school sessions we will include active games and teach the children about managing risks, outdoor safety and how to care for the natural world. Children will be provided with an all-in-one waterproof suit to wear over their usual school uniform. We suggest that all children wear trousers on Forest School days so they are comfortable in the suits. We ask that all children bring in a pair of welly boots to wear. Please use our class welly racks to store boots.

Phonics

Through our daily phonics lessons we will learn:

- the Year 1 Common Exception Words
- the graphemes c making /s/ in cell, ea making /e/ in head, are and ear making /air/ in care and pear, ew and ue making /oo/ in chew and glue, ie making /ee/ in chief
- about the vowels of the alphabet—a,e,i,o,u and the long and short vowel sounds
- that there are alternative spellings for /ai/ /ee/ /igh/ /oa/ and /oo/
- that there are spelling patterns for those graphemes, e.g that /ai/ comes in the middle of a word and /ay/ comes at the end
- to read Y2 common exception words



Homework



Homework will **begin on Friday 16th September** and then sent home each week via **Tapestry** and consist of challenges (linked to current learning) that your child can choose from and present in their own way. It will be posted as a joint Year 2 observation on Tapestry each **Friday** and needs to be completed and uploaded as an individual observation for your child by the following **Wednesday**. Please support and encourage your child when they are doing their homework, although it should primarily be their own work. All work will be viewed by the class teacher and "liked". Your child would also significantly benefit from daily reading with you using the book sent home in their bookbag and/or **Bug Club** to reinforce the phonics and reading skills they are learning in school.
