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Preschool This week, preschool children have enjoyed exploring 'size' vocabulary through their core story, exploring oats with bowls of big, medium and small for the three bears. We had some teddy bears of different sizes and also made some bear masks, we linked this to finding out the names of some real bears such as polar bear, brown bear etc. It has been lovely to hear the children using vocabulary such as 'enormous' 'mini' 'biggest' in their play. Next week , we will be making porridge to taste and thinking about how we can help the birds in the cold weather by making bird food.	<i>Year</i> 3 This week Beech and Chestnut Classes , developed their understanding of adverbs. We looked at a range of adverbs expressing time, place and cause. In maths, we focused on rectangles. The children got to explore and build shapes with four right-angles. In science, the children learned about sources of light and reflections of light. On Monday, the children did their first spelling test and will continue to have them on a Monday going forward. The spellings will go on Seesaw each week as a part of their homework and they are encouraged to go on Spelling Shed for further practise.
Reception This week Class 1 and 2 , have been 'super scientists' finding out about the human body. We enjoyed researching using a range of non-fiction books. In Literacy we have retold the story of 'The Enormous Turnip' using story language and props from our story shelves. Maths learning focused on exploring the 'one more' pattern in numbers as we count up and we used lots of practical hands-on resources to support this. Next week, we will learn new songs and use percussion instruments to tap out a steady rhythm. Please remember to send your child to school with warm clothing as we use the Reception gardens across the day. Long trousers, warm tights and a hat	<i>Year Y</i> This week Holly and Willow Classes use time connectives. We investigated how apostrophes are used to show plural possession. In maths, we secured our understanding of the divisibility rules of 3, 6 and 9 and investigated multiples of 7. In history, we acted out the capture of Caratacus and in geography we learnt how waves move and the importance of groynes. Next week , we will explore synonyms and use them in our writing. In maths, we will explore the relationships between different multi- ples and how we can present this in different ways. In science we will continue to learn about sound waves and learn to read them with accuracy.

Year This week Class 3 and Class 4 children have been identifying similarities and differ- ences of nurses and doctors uniforms and hospitals in NHS history. In English we pretended to be Sunny the Meerkat visiting our school for the first time and began to write and punctuate sentences using a capital letter and a full stop. In maths we have been solving missing number equations. Next week, in science we will be looking at which part of the body is associated with each sense. In maths we will be telling and then solving addition and subtraction stories.	This week Oak and Ash Classes looked at adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators. In English, we continued to read 'Kensuke's Kingdom' using the wonderful ideas and rich vocabulary within to write different types of poetry. In science, we applied our knowledge of forces to conduct an experiment that measured friction between different surfaces and are developing our knowledge and understanding of variables to keep it a fair test. In French, we have been learning about members of La famille and in PE we have focussed our attention on stamina and pace. Next week , we will turn our attention to multiplying fractions and finding fractions of quantities.
Year 2	Year 6
This week, Class 5 and 6 , wrote a postcard and remembered to include exclamation, statement and question sentences. In maths we explored how to use arrays to solve division and multiplication problems. We made a mind map in our enquiry lessons which was all about the NHS. Next week , now that we have learnt about the features of a letter (date, name, address, from and P.S.) we will write a letter explaining why we were late to school. I wonder what our excuses will be. In maths we will compare and order length. In our enquiry lessons we will think about what makes a healthy snack before designing our own healthy flapjack.	This week in Pine and Sycamore Classes we have been converting units of measure and using our knowledge to complete reasoning problems, In English we wrote a non- chronological report on the Victorian era, looking at workhouse life, we also read an extract from 'Ahimsa' by Supriya Kelkar. Next we will be reading more of 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty and writing a diary entry. In computing we have been programming microbits, these are connected to our IPads using Bluetooth and display our messages and symbols on LEDs – the children have been great at helping each other. Next week , we will be starting to look at decimal numbers, their value and how to round them in maths.
