#### Preschool

This week, **preschool** children enjoyed making porridge just like in our story of 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'. We used our gross motor movements to mix and thought about how it changed when we added milk, we tasted our porridge with banana. We used small bears to recap size vocabulary and counted and represented the number on our fingers. In PE we moved like buzzy bees and did so well listening carefully to instructions to 'stop', 'go', 'change direction' or 'go to the hive'. Everyone tried hard to put their own shoes on afterwards. **Next week** we will join in 'Number day' on Friday by exploring our number story sacks and singing lots of number rhymes. #### Reception

This week **Class 1 and 2**, have been busy singing and using a range of untuned percussion instruments. We have been learning about pitch and using the words 'high' and 'low' to describe the sounds we hear. We have also been thinking about how we can play our instruments 'loudly' or 'softly'. In maths we have been singing 'Five Little Speckled Frogs' and thinking about the composition of 5. In Literacy we have been using our phonic knowledge to write labels and captions for a map of the story 'The Enormous Turnip'. Please look out for the 'phonics arm' reading game that is our homework challenge this week! **Next week**, we are looking forward to tasting a range of vegetables and choosing our favourites to add to our homemade turnip soup!

#### year 1

This week **Class 3 and Class 4** have been learning dynamics and pitch in music by playing a variety of untuned instruments. We practiced a chant from 'Funnybones' by Janet and Allan Ahlberg and performed it all in class. In English we pretended to be Sunny the Meerkat visiting our school and practised saying our sentences out loud before writing them in a postcard. In science we explored our sight and hearing senses. **Next week,** in maths we will be comparing length and height.

This week, **Class 5** and **6**, wrote a letter to Mrs Lee with excuses about why we were late for school! In maths we measured and ordered objects in cms and discussed how we measure larger items in metres. What fun we had in dance with our scattering, pouring, digging and stamping mirroring movements! **Next week**, we will collect information on the NHS from books, talk about what we found out and write sentences using the conjunctions, 'when', 'and', 'because', 'but' and 'if'. In maths we are recalling facts within 20. In DT we are making a healthy snack and designing and making packaging for our healthy snack to fit into.

This week **Beech** and **Chestnut Classes**, created story openings with adjectives, verbs, adverbs, similes and onomatopoeias. In maths, we solved addition word problems. In history, we used sources and evidence to learn how the people of the Indus Valley lived. In PE, the children have been continuing developing their fitness skills including balance, stamina and endurance. Please remember that homework will be on Seesaw and that there will be a spelling test going forward every Monday.

This week **Holly** and **Willow Classes** worked diligently to secure their understanding of the 12 times tables and square numbers in maths this week. We have played lots of different math games to develop our fluency of these facts and will use this next week to support our understanding of divisibility. In English we have developed our understanding of apostrophes and how to use them to show possession and contractions. Next week, we will be exploring speech marks and how to use them accurately to show dialogue in our writing. In geography we have been learning about coastal landforms so now we can describe a bay, beach, cliff and headland. **Next week**, in science we are going to conduct an investigation to find out more about sound waves.

This week **Oak** and **Ash Classes** have worked on multiplying unit and non-unit fractions by integers and we have moved on to finding fractions of amounts which we will continue next week. In English we have studied and written Tanka poems. **Next week**, in history we will be learning more about King Alfred's battle with the Vikings for power in Wessex. Will he be able to fight them off?

This week **Pine** and **Sycamore Classes** have developed their confidence to round, add, subtract and multiply decimals by integers. In English, we learnt how to condense sentences into short note form. They wrote a diary entry from the perspective of Jim from our class novel, 'Street Child'. They demonstrated a clear understanding of the key features of a first-person recount and produced some excellent work. In geography, we discussed migration – looking at a real-life story of a girl who emigrated from Turkey to Britain. In PE we practised hockey skills and jumping off the gymnastics equipment. Finally, we worked with Mrs Peart from St Peters in our PSHE lesson to discuss the challenge of transitioning to secondary school. She will be with us on a weekly basis moving forward as part of our continual preparation for September.
