Headteacher Highlights...




- Well done to our lovely **Year 6** children for persevering and working hard in **SATs** week! Rest up this weekend because there's a play to practice now!






Classroom Curiosity...



Preschool

This week, we continued to explore 'The Gruffalo' story with puppets in a tuff tray so that we could retell the stories. We used our fine motor skills to use small shape punchers, we had to persevere to learn how to use them. On Thursday we had a very exciting morning when Mrs Shopylak came to visit with her new baby daughter, it was lovely to see them.

Next week, we will explore ice and find ways to make the ice melt to free the frozen animals!





Year R

This week, the children loved building dens at Forest School! We were real Teamwork Tigers, working together to use the ropes, tarpaulin, pegs and crates to build some fantastic shelters! We have been finding out more about animals, sea creatures and birds that live in Brazil and have been comparing these to British wildlife. In literacy we have been writing sentences using our phonic knowledge and checking our writing carefully, making sure we leave a finger space between each word and sit our letters neatly on the line. In maths we have been exploring pairs of numbers that make ten, using our fingers and a double dice frame to support this.

Next week, we will be using our own designs to create a Brazilian animal mask using collage materials! In Religious Education we will be learning about why The Bible is a very special book for Christians and the Qur'an is a very special book for Muslims.









This week, we practiced spelling new vocabulary from our text 'Journey Through the Amazon'. In DT we created a Brazilian moving picture and included a lever or a slider. In science we grouped animals into herbivores, omnivores, and carnivores.

Next week, we are writing our information leaflet on the Amazon in English. In maths we will be learning to tell the time to the half hour. We are looking forward to our church walk on Thursday as part of our RE.





This week, we learnt about the features of a non-chronological report in English. We noticed the heading, sub-headings, questions and how the sentences contain information. In maths we found out that some fractions, like one-half and two-quarters, are equivalent. We loved making our winding mechanism mock-up in our DT lesson!

Next week, we will write a geographical non-chronological report about Huntingdon and Aiuruoca in Brazil. We will compare the differences and similarities between the two places. In maths, we will learn about position and direction and know how to do a whole turn, a right angle clockwise and anti-clockwise turn, and know left and right. Perhaps on your walk to school give your child directions using this language.















This week, we have been writing formal letters in English. We have thought carefully about how to lay out a formal letter and the different kind of language and vocabulary we need to use. We have enjoyed our forest school session and displayed some excellent teamwork and listening skills. In Science we conducted an experiment where we discussed the meaning of transparent, translucent, and opaque and sorted items based on these properties. **Next** week, in maths we will be continuing to explore fractions, using a range of practical resources to support us. In English we will be writing our own metaphor poems linking to a storm and in PE we will be applying our football skills by playing a game.



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




Year 5

Measles

Did you know there is a concerning rise in measles cases across the UK? As you may be aware, measles is a highly contagious disease which can cause serious health complications, particularly in unvaccinated children. Given the increasing case numbers, it is crucial that we work together to protect the health and wellbeing of our school communities.

To support this effort, we are sharing important public health information regarding measles and the MMR (Measles, Mumps, and Rubella) vaccine, these are official UKHSA publications. There is also a poster showcasing an upcoming clinic scheduled for May half term. Raising awareness is key to encouraging uptake of the vaccine and preventing further spread.






