Empathy Day 2025

On **Thursday 12th June**, both schools will be participating in <u>Empathy Day</u>. Last year, school introduced this initiative as a way to support children's understanding of how their behaviours can both positively and negatively effect others. We had several unwanted prejudiced behaviours displayed towards both staff and children by *some* children. Whilst we have not eradicated these behaviours they have diminished. However, we can always do more to educate our children, hence supporting **Empathy Day** to create a better school. Activities will include reading a variety of **diverse texts** linked including an in-depth look at 'Invisible' by Tom Percival in the Infant school and 'Each Kindness' by Jacqueline Woodston in the Junior School. The children will be **painting/decorating pebbles** which we will hide in the community – to cheer people up! Let us know if you find one! We will participate in Empathy Lab assemblies and hopefully our day will shine a light on the role of books in raising an empathy educated generation.

Classroom Curiosity...



Preschool

This week, we have begun reading our new core book of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle. We are looking at plants and growing this term, so this week we have planted tomato plants as well as root potatoes and beans in bags so that we can watch their roots grow.

Next week, we will plant peas and we will begin our transition to Reception by visiting the classrooms for story times.

Year R

This week, we have started our new enquiry learning about 'The Wright Brothers' and the first flight. We had a wonderful day at The Shuttleworth Collection looking at lots of old airplanes from the past, exploring the beautiful Swiss Gardens and riding a 102 year old bus! The children have enjoyed using the props on our story shelves to retell the traditional tale 'The Three Little Pigs'. In maths, we have been learning pairs of number that make 5 by heart and have introduced using a range of hands-on resources to explore sharing equally.


Next week, we will be thinking about our lives and what our 'personal timeline' might look like, as well as playing games to develop our knowledge of odd and even numbers and sharing sets of objects equally.






This week, we all enjoyed our trip to Shuttleworth and in history we have started to ask questions about the past. In English we have read, 'Anansi and the Golden Pot' and learnt some new vocabulary.

Next week, in science we are going to go on a walk around our school grounds observing a variety of plants and trees. In maths we will be solving subtraction problems for teen numbers.









This week, we have learnt how to find symmetrical lines in 2D shapes. In English, we used expanded noun phrases to describe a setting in our new text, 'Lila and the Secret of the Rain'. We investigated plant seeds in science.

Next week, we will make some 3D shapes in maths and talk about their properties. In English, we will plan our own version of a story. We are looking forward to some computing lessons where we will take photographs using landscape and portrait.








This week, we have really enjoyed thinking about unit fractions in many different contexts in maths. We used a range of physical resources to explore and displayed some excellent teamwork skills. In English we became authors! We wrote an introduction in the style of the author of our class text 'The Nothing to See Here Hotel', ensuring we used a range of exciting vocabulary, including similes, rhetorical questions and adverbs. **Next week**, we will begin planning our castles in DT before we build them. It would be great if the children could bring in any junk modelling resources to support with this, such as kitchen roll tubes, cardboard and cereal boxes.





This week, the children wrote their endings to our class novel, 'Boy Overboard', as it ends on a bit of a cliff hanger. In music, we explored how to make music with our bodies by clapping, rubbing, stomping, clicking and tapping. Next week, we will learn about Alfred the Great in history. If you have any cardboard at home, can you please bring it in, the children need it for their upcoming DT project. Thank you!

Year 5

This week, we have finished making our clay circuses in D.T. In English, we have started planning a narrative based on the class text, 'Who Let the Gods Out'.

Next week, we will write our narratives. We will start our new topics in PE: athletics and cricket. Please send the children in with their coats, OPAL Lunchtimes means we go out in all weathers and lots of children are getting wet.



This week, we have been planning and writing a descriptive setting about Whitby Abbey using tension and suspense. We have had fun trying to make our readers 'sit on the edge of their seats'! In maths, we have a started bakery investigation which has involved using ratio to work out the ingredients needed to make a set of cupcakes, as well as knowledge of percentages and fractions to work out the best value for money. We had a visit from a member St Peter's to talk about what school is like at secondary school and this was also an opportunity for children to pose any related questions. The rest of the week has all been about rehearsals! **Next week**, we will continue with editing our writing and practising our lines for the play.
