## **Classroom Curiosity...**



## **Preschool**

**This week**, we have been using dice, we are becoming very skilled at subitising (saying how many without counting) and recognising the patterns on the dice, we rolled large dice outside and also played small games using dice. We also represented number on our fingers or by making marks on the ground with chalks.

We continued our 'transition to Reception' activities by visiting the teachers in Class 1 and 2 for story times.

**Next week,** we will be using our core story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' to look at and begin to recognise pattern as well as continuing our small games with dice.

## Year R

**This week** we have enjoyed using the programmable Bee-Bots, experimenting with building simple commands to move them around on a grid. In mini-me time we have been writing about some of our favourite fairy tales using our phonic knowledge to write captions and sentences. In maths we have been getting so good at using the Rekenreks to subitise 1-5, remembering 'one finger, one push' and we have been using the comparative language of 'more', 'greater', 'fewer', 'less' and 'equal' when talking about quantities.

**Next week,** we will be learning about the British sculptor Antony Gormley, looking at examples of his work and thinking about what he uses to create his pieces. The children will have the opportunity to explore clay and have a go at the coiling technique, using this technique to create their own sculpture!

#### Year 1

**This week,** we have been like Reflective Rex, editing and improving our writing. In maths, we used our knowledge of number facts within 10, to help us solve problems involving teens numbers. **Next week,** we will be beginning our science investigation into which material will be the best for our paper aeroplanes. In art we will be designing our own sculptures.

#### Year 2

**This week,** we completed a story in English and remembered to use conjunctions. In maths, we made a pictogram and answered questions such as, what is the most popular and how many more. We made posters in Enquiry lessons about the historic airfield Portholme, Godmanchester.

**Next week**, in English we will be participating in a performance to recite a poem by heart and will generate new vocabulary for our own poem. In maths, we will compare and order mass in grams and kilograms. We are looking forward to learning about the work of British sculptor Antony Gormley.

#### Year 3

This week, we have shown amazing determination and perseverance during our assessment week, we are so proud of them all! In English, we wrote fantastic newspaper reports based on an exciting event from our class text, 'The Nothing to See Here Hotel', where we included a range of Year 3 writing skills, including exciting vocabulary, direct speech, and paragraphs. In PE we have shown great teamwork when exploring hockey skills. Next week, we will be continuing our fraction work in maths, thinking carefully about adding fractions where the denominator stays the same and in DT we will be continuing our work building and evaluating our 3D castles

#### Year 4

**This week,** was **assessment week** and we are incredibly proud of the children for all of their efforts during the tests. In history, we learned about the Battle of Edington and in geography we talked about the Northern lights. **Next week**, we will begin our division unit in maths and explore features of a newspaper article in English.

#### Year 5

**This week,** we had **assessment week**. Even though it was super hot outside, we tried our best in our assessments. We continued to improve our cricket skills and have planned a diary entry based on our class novel.

**Next week**, we will continue to read our class novel, deepen our knowledge of fractions and continue our fact files on Oliver Cromwell.

#### Year 6

**This week** we have been planning the final piece of writing which will include lots of dialogue to make our narratives action-packed. We are delighted to see how far the children have come with their writing and are looking forward to reading their final pieces next week. We have continued to practise for the Y6 Leaver's Performance too - lots of lovely singing can now be heard echoing throughout the school. Swimming continued this week for some of our students and Sycamore enjoyed meeting Mrs Hill from St Peter's for a French lesson. **Next week** it will be Pine's turn for a French lesson with Mrs Hill from St Peter's School. We will continue to practice for the Y6 Leaver's Performance.
