Classroom Curiosity...



Preschool

This week, we looked at repeating patterns using buttons and reels on caterpillars, we began to be able to create our own patterns sometimes with three or four different colours amazing work! We also looked carefully at the image of the caterpillar on the front of our book and created our own paintings or drawings. We also tasted watermelon at snack this week just like the very hungry caterpillar (thank you Blake!).

Next week, we will be singing songs and also recapping all of the sounds that we have learnt this year -/s/,/a/,/t/,/p/,/i/,/n/ with activities such as our 'silly soup' game.










Year R

This week, we have been learning about the British sculptor Antony Gormley, looking at examples of his work and thinking about what he uses to create his pieces. The children have loved exploring clay and having a go at the coiling technique. In literacy we have been writing speech bubbles for the big bad wolf and the three little pigs, and the children have

come up with some brilliant sentences! Maths learning has focused on quick recall of pairs of numbers that 5 a total of 5 or ten.

Next week, the Reception gardens will have a shock visit from the big bad wolf! (Shhh!) The children will be challenged to investigate the scene and will be 'reporting officers', composing and writing a police report! In our Enquiry sessions, we will be thinking about the best material to use to make an aeroplane and having a go at making and flying some aeroplanes of our own!







Year 1

This week, we were counting in 2s, 5s and 10s in maths. Look out for homework this week and help your children to practice. In art we practiced coiling and pinching with clay.

Next week, we will be carrying out our science investigation and making our clay sculpture.





Year 2

This week, we had great fun making up our own nonsense words when writing a poem in English. In maths, we learnt how to compare and order mass using grams and kilograms. We learnt how framing is important when taking a photograph in our computing lesson.

Next week, we are writing our own version of 'The Giant's Rucksack' poem, using the vocabulary we created this week. We will investigate capacity in maths and learn that it can be measured using I and mI. In art we will use clay material to practise the technique of slabbing.

Year 3

This week, in maths we have been working hard to explore non-unit fractions of quantities and we have identified when the numerator and denominator match it shows the whole. In science we conducted an experiment, thinking carefully about how different liquids can affect teeth and the importance of teeth hygiene.

Next week, we will be continuing to practise our athletic skills in preparation for Sports Day.

Year 4

This week, we have started a newspaper article in English looking at headlines and the 5ws [where, what, when, why and X]. In science, the children brushed their teeth and decided if an electric toothbrush or manual toothbrush was better at removing plaque.

Next week, we will be starting division with remainders in maths.







Year 5

This week, we have been applying our knowledge of Oliver Cromwell to create non chronological reports. We have also improved our relay techniques.

Next week, we will read more of our class novel – we love it! We will also continue to learn more about spaghetti bolognaise in D.T.

Year 6



This week, we are busy continuing to rehearse the play, we are making sure we have learnt all our lines and actions. We are also making props and scenery ready for our performances. We have read the next chapter of 'Norah' (our class book) and refreshed our maths skills.

Next week, we will polish our performances and some of us are going to do transition days at Hinchingbrooke – we are looking forward to finding out about the new school!
