

## Classroom Curiosity...




## Preschool

**This week**, we explored some ice on our very hot days, touching the wet surface helped us to cool down. We also watched what happened as the ice warmed up and melted. We created painting linked to 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and made more patterns with peg boards. We used our 'phonics telescope' to look through and identify objects starting with the initial sound that Mrs. Shurlock said. We had to choose the right one from two objects and were absolutely amazing at doing this, we are ready for Reception!

**Next week**, we will be trying to draw some self portraits looking at ourselves and thinking about how we have grown and changed over our year at Preschool and thinking of all the things we can now do.








## Year R

**This week** the reception gardens had a visit from the big bad wolf! The children enjoyed being 'detective inspectors' and writing a report for the police! They suggested some pretty harsh consequences for his behaviour! In maths we have been thinking about doubles and 'not doubles' and linking this to our developing knowledge of odd and even numbers. Our enquiry learning has centred on testing out a range of materials to help us decide what we should use to make an aeroplane that will 'fly' when thrown in the garden!

**Next week** in our Religious Education sessions we will be learning about how Christians and Muslims welcome and celebrate the birth of a new baby. In PSHE we will be thinking about how members of our family and other trusted people care for and look after us and learning about ways we can take responsibility for keeping ourselves clean.









## Year 1

**This week**, we had fun pinching and coiling clay to make our plane sculptures and we were like Perseverance Parrot. In maths we have been solving problems involving 2p, 5p and 10p coins. You can support us with our counting in this week's homework.

**Next week**, we are going to paint and evaluate our sculptures before we take them home. We will also finish our computing unit on using an ipad to write.

## Year 2

**This week**, we have enjoyed practical activities. In art we were learning about the sculptor Antony Gormley. We used clay to make a sculpture. In science, we carried out an investigation linked to materials to find out which material will fly the further distance.

**Next week**, we will visit the Junior School to watch a performance. Our music lessons will focus on the long and short sounds in music. In science we will summarise our results and say what we have found out.







## Year 3

In mastering number we have been practising our known multiplication facts in the style of Y4 'Going for Gold'. We will be bringing our cards home to continue practising over the summer.

**Next week**, we will be writing a narrative in English based on our class text 'The Nothing to See Here Hotel' and we will be evaluating our DT castles before we bring them home.






## Year 4
