Maths

This half term we will be learning to:

- Make different arrangements within 5
- Develop our conceptual subitising skills
- Connect quantities and numbers to finger patterns
- Hear and join in with the counting sequence and connect this to the 'staircase' pattern – the idea of 'one more than'
- Develop counting skills and knowledge
- Compare sets of objects by matching
- Develop the language of 'whole' when talking about objects which have parts
- Select, rotate and manipulate shapes to develop spatial reasoning skills

Everyday maths:

During our daily snack time and morning routines, we will use our counting skills to find out how many children are present in our class each day and count out snack to share. We will learn about days of the week when we complete our class calendar and discuss what is first, then and next on our visual timetable.

Physical Education

In Reception the children will enjoy one PE session each week.
This will include both indoor and outdoor PE.

Class 1 PE: Thursday Class 2 PE: Tuesday

Please ensure that your child wears their PE kit to school on their PE days. This includes trainers, joggers, shorts, t-shirts and a sweatshirt. Please be reminded that <u>earrings cannot be worn</u> in PE and long hair must be tied back. Unfortunately, we cannot remove earrings from your child, so please remember to do so on the required days.

Forest School

During the autumn term, we will be observing seasonal change, comparing autumn and winter, and exploring what we can do on our forest school site. We will hunt for plants and minibeasts, using collection pots, observational drawing and simple labels to present what we find, and always encourage the children to use accurate scientific vocabulary for these living things. During forest school sessions we will include active games and teach the children about managing risks, outdoor safety and how to care for the natural world.

Children will be provided with an all-in-one waterproof suit to wear over their usual school uniform. We suggest that all children wear trousers on Forest School days so they are comfortable in the suits.

We ask that all children bring in a pair of welly boots to wear. Please use our class welly racks to store boots.

PSHE

This half term children will learn to:

- Identify special people in their lives and will explore why they are so important.


Phonics

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Through our daily phonics lessons, we will learn to:

- · Read individual letters by saying the sounds for them
- Blend sounds into words to read short words made up of known letter-sound correspondences
- Write some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them
- Segment the sounds (phonemes) in simple words and blend them together
- Continue to recognise and say the phonemes: s a t p i n m d g o c k ck h b f and ff
- Learn the new phonemes: e u r l ll ss w x y v j z zz q
