They will consider answers to questions including 'What are some ways in which I use technology and the internet and what are the benefits?', 'What is meant by "identity" and how might someone's identity online be different from their identity in the physical world?' and 'What are some examples of online content or contact which might mean I feel unsafe, worried or upset?' We will then be talking about how to report something and find out who and how to ask for help.</p>
<p>Forest School</p> <p>This term in our weekly Forest School sessions we will explore signs of winter when learning about the different seasons and share what we know in different ways. As always, we will encourage active play in Forest School with a range of songs and games, linked to nature and weather. We will develop our construction skills when erecting dens, working as Team Work Tiger, thinking carefully about making these stronger and more stable as part of our DT curriculum. Children will be provided with an all-in-one waterproof suit to wear over their usual school uniform. We suggest that all children wear trousers on Forest School days so they are comfortable in the suits.</p> <p>Please use our <u>class welly racks</u> to store boots Year 1 Forest School is on Tuesday.</p>	<p>Phonics</p> <p>Through our daily phonics lessons we will learn to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • read and write Year 1 Common Exception Words (CEWs) • recognise the split digraphs a_e, e_e, i_e, o_e and u_e • add the suffixes; ed and ing to words where there is no change to the root word • explore plurals by adding s or es to the end of words • apply phonics knowledge to every day reading and writing <p>Don't forget you can find a copy of our CEW and phonic mats on our school website: Welcome to Hartford Infant School - Hartford Infant School</p>	<p>Homework</p> <p>Homework is sent out weekly via a homework book and consist of phonics, spelling and/or maths challenges. It will be sent out each Friday and needs to be completed by the following Wednesday. Please support and encourage your child when they are doing their homework, although it should primarily be their own work. All work will be checked by the class teacher and stamped with an Aim High Hippo. Your child would also significantly benefit from daily reading with you using the book sent home in their bookbag and/or Bug Club to reinforce the phonics and reading skills they are learning in school. The children also have access to Numbots which we recommend them completing 3-4 times a week.</p>
